

Star in the sky, Beautiful light Now angels sing Alleluia! Alleluia!
















Matthew 2: 1-12 The Wise Men


When they saw the star, they were overjoyed.







Caspar But Dagmar, you've been studying the stars for years. You know how important this is. You know this chance won't ever come again.


Benediction
