

For you have Jesus Christ everyday of your life.



He is faithful in all he does.





-where Satan has his throne.


Yet you remain true to my name.

Nevertheless, I have a few things against you: There are some among you who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin so that they ate food sacrificed to idols and committed sexual immorality. Likewise, you also have those who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans.



Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.



Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place. But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.



Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give some of the hidden manna.

I will also give that person a white stone with a new name written on it, known only to the one who receives it.





Lord, help us to follow the example of the 18th century Berean Christians, whose practice was to validate all teachings and exhortations against the Holy scriptures.




