

Oh happy birthday to you, oh happy birthday to you.


For you have Jesus Christ everyday of your life.

## Exodus 25: 1-8


The LORD said to Moses, "Tell the Israelites to bring me an offering. You are to receive the offering for me from everyone whose heart prompts them to give."

- acacia wood;






- olive oil for the light;




## Difference between charity and loving-kindness
